Dolphins have outstanding vision whether they are in or out of the water. In the water, their eyes are protected from the sea water by mucus 26 from glands. The dolphin’s swimming power comes from its caudal fluke. Unlike fish, the way of movement is up and down 27 side to side. The dorsal fin serves the function of stabilization and may also regulate body temperature --- a dolphin’s body heat is very close to human body heat at 97.7°F (36.5C).

As to dolphins’ life span, 28, dolphins have lived as long as 40 years. In the wild, though, scientists believe they only live 25 to 30 years. As to 29, mature female dolphins will give birth every 2 to 3 years and could give birth as many as eight times during their lifetimes. Supposedly, traveling as much as they do, dolphins must rest some time. However, they hardly sleep. They merely take cat naps on the ocean’s surface for two or three minutes at a time. At night, the slight difference is that length of those naps increases to seven or eight minutes. How fast do they swim? They typically 30 at 5 to 7 miles per hour. However, a new record was set since they have been clocked at 18 to 22 miles per hour with top speed of 30 miles per hour.
